History of North East

Captain John Smith's expedition found its way to the Northeast River in 1608. The North East area provided Indians with abundant hunting grounds and a fishery rich in stock.

Amid numerous skirmishes and treaties with the Indian tribes, European settlers moved south from Delaware and Pennsylvania to the area. Likewise, settlers arrived by water from Virginia and other parts of Maryland. In 1711, there was a mill where the Big and Little North East creeks came together. In 1716 there was another mill at the falls in North East. In 1739, George Whitefield (preached to about 1,500 people at North East (from his diary).

Throughout the early history of North East, the Northeast River has played a significant role. The ruins of an early mill stand today (site 4) near the Mill House. The frame building of the Mill House, circa 1710, represents an outstanding example of early vernacular architecture.

Because of the availability of water for power, British businessmen established in 1735 the Principio Company, an iron works near North East, which became known as the North East Forge. George Washington's father and brother maintained an interest in the Principio Company. After confiscation from the British in 1780, Thomas Russell and his son operated the forge until it was leased to James and George Whitaker in 1829. After the Whitakers sold the forge in 1837, several other owners operated the forge until 1847 when it was purchased by Jethro McCullough, Delaphine McDaniel and Edward Harvy. The McCullough and Iron Company, formed in 1861, produced the first galvanized sheet iron in the United States.

In 1706, The General Assembly of Maryland passed an act establishing the North Elk Parish. After fire destroyed the original church, the current structure was constructed in 1742-43. The granite cornerstone of the church bears the initials of the 1742 rector and his vestry. Before Queen Anne of England died in 1714, she set aside and allocated funds for missionary work overseas. From Queen Anne's bounty, St. Mary's received a silver chalice and paten made in London, 1716-1717; a large Bible printed in Oxford, England in 1716 and a large Book of Common Prayer. It is believed that in appreciation for these gifts, the name was changed to St. Mary Anne's Church (site 11).

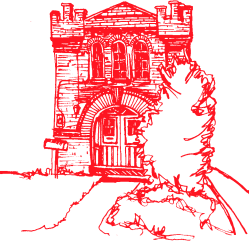
Although times have changed, the small town continues to offer the beauty of the water that attracted its original settlers and the charm of small town life. We invite you to share in the history of our town.

1. OLD TOWN LOCKUP

This two-story brick edifice, circa 1885, was built along the Old Philadelphia to Baltimore Road. Until the late 1980's, the building served as the town hall.



2. WEST LOG HOME

This late 18th century colonial-style dwelling was once used as an inn and stage stop.



3. ANDY ANDERSON'S HOME

This lovely example of the Victorian era was originally the home of a local hardware store owner. It remains today as a private home.



4. MILL HOUSE

The Mill House was built in sections, with the earliest part dating to the first quarter of the 18th century. An early mill site was originally adjacent to the House. Paneling from this home is in the Cecil bedroom in the Winterthur Museum in Delaware.



5. 5 & 10 ANTIQUE MARKET

This large frame Victorian building was originally constructed as a hotel. Today, it houses a multi-dealer antique market.



6. 110 SOUTH MAIN STREET

This masonry and frame structure originally served as the post office.



7. SIMCOE HOUSE

This log and frame 18th century structure has served as a home and offices over its history.



8. REYNOLDS HOUSE

This log home represents the Federal period.



9. THE WILLIAM RONEY HOUSE

This Victorian home, with its checked lattice, retains many of its original architectural elements, and is currently a bed and breakfast, The Inn at North East Creek.



10. HANNUM HOUSE

This house is on The Maryland Historical Sites Survey. Early maps indicate a coffin maker resided here.



11. ST. MARY ANNE'S CHURCH

This Colonial era church retains much of the original exterior. The bell tower in the south wall was donated by the Brookings Family. The church is surrounded by a very early cemetery.



12. NORTH EAST UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

The congregation dates from 1781. The first Methodist Parsonage in the United States was located here.



13. RONEY & WELLS

This old structure served as a hardware store until the family closed it in 1989. Today it is England's Colony on the Bay Gift & Christmas Shop.



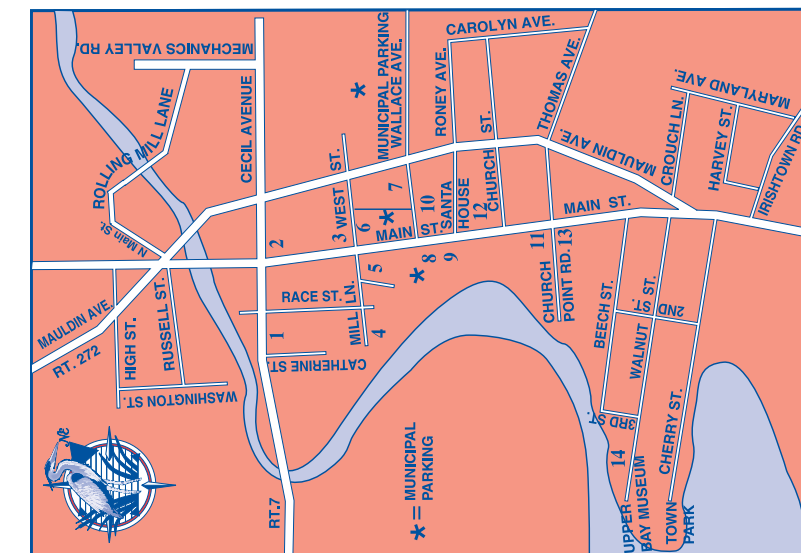
14. UPPER BAY MUSEUM

The Museum houses a collection of water-oriented artifacts. Built in 1880, this structure was originally a fish house.

Strolling Guide Map

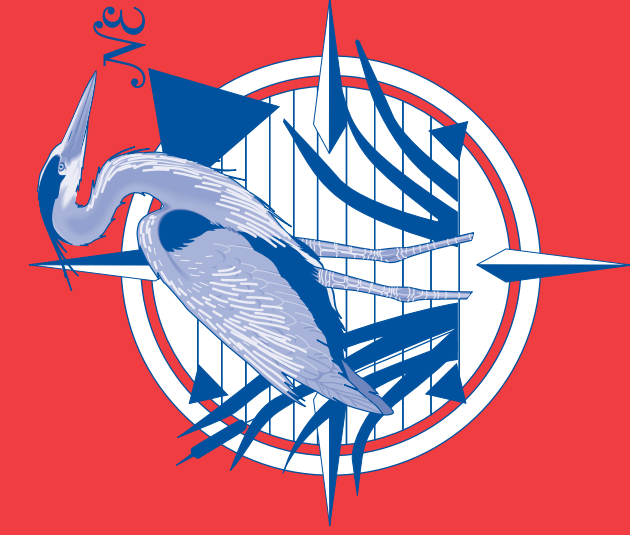
